

Policy Overview

- 1) Reading: Students are expected to read each night for 20 minutes or more.
- 2) Homework: The points assigned to each assignment vary. Most assignment will receive a Rubric for students to know how they will be graded. Most homework will begin in the classroom. Honors course assignments are categorized to give emphasis to important coursework.
- 3) Vocabulary: Must be studied and learned to be used with work in future classes .
- 4) Please read the Code of Student Conduct for Broward County Public Schools.
- 5) Attendance: If your child is going to be absent this must be reported at 754-323-0350. The report must come from the parent or guardian and give student ID, birthdate, grade, the date(s) of absence, and reason.
- 6) Absences: If student is absent, any previously Assigned work is due upon return to the classroom. They will be allowed two days to complete the missed work with an **Excused Absence, or receive 10% of the grade**, if unexcused. Any exams will be 60%.
- 7) Dress Code: Please be in charge of your child's attire attending school. I am stringent upon Broward County's Code of Student Conduct, to include dress code to ensure student safety and focus on the material.
- 8) Phone Use: In my classroom cellphones are not allowed unless they are part of the lesson.
- 9) Classroom supplies: Students should have The basic pen, notebook, and loose-leaf paper.
