In this section (half of the page)

In this space write sentences that:

- are about the section you are reading;
- a question you may have;
- a word that you do not know
- a portion of a sentence that shows important information
- a quote that seems important to you;
- or any other information that you think is relevant or revealing;
- a literary element you may discover that is significant to the text
- the page number

Example:

- 1) *I wonder what "wriggling" means (page 20)?*

In this section:

- respond to what you wrote on the left
- explain
- tell why you wonder or have a question
- define the word from the dictionary
- add more information to the text that you feel is relevant to what you are reading.

This section is to write what you feel and think about the text and answer any questions you have on the left.

The Text/Me Chart is a graphic organizer that assists with making sense of the text that is in study. Use this tool to show that you are analyzing what you read. You should use this chart to ask questions; document information about the text; and write down any ideas that come from the text. You will then write information on the right to respond to what you wrote on the left. Basically, you are having a conversation with the text. For most Text/Me assignments, you will write at least ten (10) entries in each column. You may use both sides of the page (front and
